The Bryan Museum

Housed in the historic Galveston Orphans Home, this museum features the world's largest collection of historical artifacts, documents & artwork relating to the American West.

1892 Bishop's Palace

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, this former private residence is one of the most architecturally significant Victorian residences in the country. Tours held daily.

Galveston Railroad Museum

2602 Santa Fe Place 409.765.5700 Boasts one of the largest restored railroad collections in the southwest. Engaging exhibits, frequent special events, and Harborside Express train rides every Saturday.

Moody Gardens Rainforest Pyramid

Moody Gardens 3D & 4D FX Theaters

Pier 21 Theater

Rosenberg Library

The oldest public library in Texas in continuous operation. Special collection exhibits include historical Galveston & early TX artifacts, as well as a sizable collection of Russian & Greek icons and the Fox Rare Book Room. Special programs weekly.

Ocean Star Offshore Drilling Rig Museum

Retired jackup drilling rig with three floors of models & interactive displays relating the science of the offshore oil & gas, including seismic technology, exploration and production. Self-guided tour.
